estimate. On a strictly proportionate (pro-rata) basis we would expect 25% of the estimates to be collected and spent by the end of the March quarter.

The domestic revenues performance was below expectations, with the main shortcomings identified in sales taxes, turnover taxes and taxes from the port. The combination of delays in the introduction of revenue measures targeting companies operating in the telecommunication, energy and water business; and the bad weather which negatively impacted revenues collection from the port can explain the underperformance.

The Kingdom of Saudi Arabia disbursed a \$20 million grant for arrears payments that was not in the original budget.

Since the 2016 budget was approved there have been some changes made to the revenue assumptions, including confirmation of a pledged grant from Turkey to be \$14 million, and revised disbursements from other donors. The Ministry of Finance is in the process of conducting a 2016 Revised Budget for revenues and expenditures and the results of that review, once approved, will be reflected in future reports.

REVENUE IN DETAIL FOR Q1, 2016

Revenues for the first quarter of 2016 are shown in the table below and amounted to \$51.9 million, which represents approximately 21 percent of the annual budget. The overall trend masks remarkably different developments in the revenue categories. In general, domestic revenues collection underperformed, while the picture is mixed for grants.

Revenues from personal income tax underperformed, reflecting the fact that wages and allowances in most MDAs were paid for only two months during the first quarter. Instead, corporate profit taxes and taxes on rental income are in line with budgeted amounts, with the latter over-performing thanks to progress made in the registration of companies.

Tax arrangements with telecommunication companies, and companies operating in the energy and water industries did not materialize, leading to an underperformance of the turnover tax. However, the department of Inland Revenue Services is actively engaged in discussions with the business community to make sure that commitments taken under these arrangements will be met in the future. The collection of sales taxes from hotels also has not started yet.

Trade taxes amounted to \$18.4 million, as bad weather impacted operations at Mogadishu Port, with high winds making it difficult for smaller vessels to dock safely especially during the month of January.

Revenues from fees at the airport and harbor were especially low during the first two months of the quarter (below \$0.5 million in total), but have since then recovered as flights by Turkish Airlines resumed.

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EXPENDITURE IN DETAIL FOR Q1, 2016

Expenditures are displayed in the table on the following page.

Expenditures for the first quarter of 2016 amounted to \$51.9 million, which was 84.1 percent of target, 21 percent of annual budget, and 99.8 percent of the revenue receipts during the quarter. Expenditures were 53 percent higher than the quarterly average for 2015.

Compensation of employees accounted for 34.3 percent of total expenditures over the quarter, illustrating the significant proportion of salary expenses in the total budget. This is partly explained by a 7 percent increase in the number of civil servants in 2016 compared to the previous year. The increase in staff occurred for the most part in the non-security sectors, and is aimed at strengthening the capacity of MDAs.

The stock of existing arrears was reduced by \$25.4 million, or slightly more than 80 percent of the budget amount for 2016, reflecting the intent of the FGSto clear arrears by the end of the financial year. Of the \$25.4 million arrears payments made in the first quarter, \$20.3 million was made in salary and allowance payments covering mainly 4 months of payments for civil servants and the security sector. The remaining \$2.9 million was made on goods and services payment and part-repayment of revolving loans taken in 2013.

Only 4.2% of the capital budget was expended in the first quarter, due to delays in the disbursement of grants bythe donors.

Inter-governmental transfers to sub-national states performed below target, at 12.8% of budgeted estimates.
